1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

1 Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. 2 For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. 3 When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labour pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief;5 for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. 6 So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; 7 for those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. 8 But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. 9 For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, 10 who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. 11 Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

Matthew 214-30

14 "For it is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; 15 to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. 16 The one who had received the five talents went off at once and traded with them, and made five more talents. 17 In the same way, the one who had the two talents made two more talents. 18 But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

After a long time the master of those slaves came and settled accounts with them. ²⁰ Then the one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents. '21 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.

'22 And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.'23 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' 24 Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed;25 so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' 26 But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? 27 Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest.

For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, 10 who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. 1 Thess. 5:9

I'm sure that we have all heard the words 'Ready, steady, Go! At the start of a race or a task to be done, if you are a runner you may want to pace yourself and just on the final bend put in a blistering final hundred yards to take the prize. The man in the parable gives tasks to the three servants each according to his ability, the first servant is obviously gifted, as is the second, but the third servant may not be the one for the task in hand, it may be looking after the livestock is more his forte or even keeping the place clean, rather than being a speculator of wealth, he looks after the money the best way that he can, he hides it! After all what is they say when you invest 'the value of your investment can fall as well as rise', not a very good prospect if you don't know where to invest your loot.

Perhaps the man half suspects that it is wise not to give this servant too much responsibility. Time passes and the unfortunate servant is cast aside having no worth to his Master. If the servant had just tried, the man would have made a job for him, but he didn't try. Jesus is making the point that whoever we are, we can at least work at our faith, it is no good proclaiming to be a Christian and then not doing anything else. This text is useful for any Minister wishing to encourage people to use their gifts and talents to the Glory of God, especially if there is a specific task in mind. Sometimes we are not sure why God calls us to do specific tasks and we may get overwhelmed by the scale of the task ahead. I was challenged and I responded to the challenge, I may never know if I ever achieved what was being put before me, but at least I know that I have tried.

In his letter to the Thessalonians Paul outlines when the Lord comes, it will be suddenly and without warning, scary stuff indeed. At the time Paul was writing about 'the end times', these were expected to be very imminent, here we are over 2000 years later, and they are still imminent, it could happen at any time, are we ready? The prophet Zephaniah gave a very graphic prophecy of what the Day of the Lord would be like. We can see what will happen to those who don't take God seriously. Time and time again the prophets have railed against those who do not take God's message and act on it seriously, the Covenant made with God had been forgotten and it may be that Zephaniah was listened to by King Josiah, who made extensive reforms when he discovered the scrolls hidden in the Temple.

I hope that we are ready, or as ready as we ever will be. Jesus in his talks with his disciples and followers and even to the Scribes and Pharisees is trying to say salvation is within everyone's grasp,

it could happen at any time. Paul reassures the Thessalonians that they will gain salvation because they know Jesus and they do not live like those who are ignorant of the Love of God, but that they are ready and waiting for the day when the God will call time and we will all be saved.

Let us not be like the lazy servant, but let us be keen and ready. Let us be the best disciples that we can be, using all our gifts and talents to the glory of God, Amen.

Take my life, and let it be consecrated, Lord, to thee; take my moments and my days, let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my hands, and let them move at the impulse of thy love; take my feet, and let them be swift and beautiful for thee.

Take my voice, and let me sing always, only, for my King; take my lips, and let them be filled with messages from thee.

Take my silver and my gold, not a mite would I withhold; take my intellect, and use every power as thou shalt choose. Take my will, and make it thine; it shall be no longer mine; take my heart, it is thine own; it shall be thy royal throne.

Take my love, my Lord, I pour at thy feet its treasure-store; take myself, and I will be ever, only, all for thee.
